Comets, supernovae, black holes, and quasars are among the "monsters" of the book's title--extraordinary astronomical bodies and phenomena that scientists

now believe are the key to understanding the rules of the universe. \"Monsters in the Sky\" is the sequel to Paolo Maffei's popular \"Beyond the Moon\" (MIT Press, 1978), which gave lay readers a grand tour of the natural order of the universe. Beginning with comets, \"Monsters in the Sky\" moves outward from our solar system, from one enigma to the next, ending with those farthest removed, the invisible \"hidden mass\" of galactic clusters extremely distant from us. Between the comets and the hidden galactic mass, the book's topics include: satellite clouds, dust rings, cyrillics and tektites, the mysterious planet Vulcan, nebulae and novae, super-supernovae, \"runaway stars,\" the future of our own star, X-rays, the probable cause of the dinosaurs' demise, black holes (probably one of the best discussions of this subject), white holes, journeys through space-time, BL Lacertae objects, Markarian, N, and Seyfert galaxies, quasars, and anomalous red shifts.

Al terzetto di unirà segretamente il maresciallo dei carabinieri Iginio \"Joe\" Callegari, che non crede alla colpevolezza di Vittorio Gugliaro. Sarà un'inchiesta faticosa, la loro, complessa, condotta sul filo del rasoio, per di più trascinata, tra mille ostacoli, colpi di scena e verità inaspettate, in una Milano oppressa da un caldo tropicale che ottunde le menti e fiacca i corpi, una città nerissima, nella quale, parallelamente allo svolgimento del caso, si assiste allo sgretolamento del rapporto tra Daniele Ferrazza e la sua compagna, l'anchor woman della tv Laura Barbieri. Milano rovente è un romanzo noir di denuncia, un'indagine a tutto tondo sugli aspetti neri del mondo nel quale viviamo. Un romanzo che fa male, perché spiazza il lettore, costringendolo a porsi delle domande alle quali è difficile dare risposte. Alessandro Bastasi è nato a Treviso nel 1949. Giurisprudenza italiana

The passions have long been condemned as a creator of disturbance and purveyor of the temporary loss of reason, but as Remo Bodei argues in *Geometry of the Passions*, we must abandon the perception that order and disorder are in a constant state of collision. By means of a theoretical and historical analysis, Bodei interprets the relationship between passion and reason as a conflict between two complementary logics. *Geometry of the Passions* investigates the paradoxical

conflict-collaboration between passions and reason, and between individual and political projects. Tracing the roles passion and reason have played throughout history, including in the political agendas of Descartes, Hobbes, and the French Jacobins, *Geometry of the Passions* reveals how passion and reason may be used as a vehicle for affirmation rather than self-enslavement.

The Collapsing Universe

Minimum income schemes (MIS) have become key social protection institutions for European citizens, but we know little regarding the logic and dynamics of institutional change in this policy field. This book provides an analytical model that will facilitate an understanding of the scope and direction of recent reforms, offering insight into the conditions under which minimum income schemes are introduced, expanded or retrenched. Natili presents a comparative analysis of policy trajectories of minimum income schemes in Italy and Spain between the mid-1980s and 2015. Although these two countries had similar points of departure, and faced comparable functional pressures and institutional constraints, they experienced remarkably different developments in this policy field in the last two decades. This comparative analysis provides empirical evidence of the impacts of different types of credit-claiming dynamics resulting from the interaction of socio-political demand with political supply. The *Politics of Minimum Income* also assesses the reform processes both in countries that have introduced MIS in the age of austerity (such as Portugal) and in countries that have retrenched them (Austria and Denmark).

Monsters in the Sky

Here Sian Lewis considers the full range of female existence in classical Greece - childhood and old age, unfree and foreign status, and the ageless woman characteristic of Athenian red-figure painting. Ceramics are an unparalleled resource for women's lives in ancient Greece, since they show a huge number of female types and activities. Yet it can be difficult to interpret the meanings of these images, especially when they seem to conflict with literary sources. This much-needed study shows that it is vital to see the vases as archaeology as well as art, since context is the key to understanding which images can stand as evidence for the real lives of women, and which should be reassessed.
